## REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY

JULY 28, 2024  
17<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:  
BREAD FOR LIFE

The core of this Sunday's Scriptures is the Gospel recounting of Jesus feeding the multitudes with five loaves and two fish – one of few events recounted in all four Gospels. It is important as a foreshadowing of the Eucharist to the early Christian communities and to the Church.

This particular section from John's Gospel, Chapter 6, is called the Bread of Life discourse, and we shall hear portions of this chapter proclaimed in the weeks ahead – which put us in the perfect place to reflect on the meaning and power of the Eucharist in our lives. Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and distributed them to the people who were there, seeking to listen to Jesus, obtain healing and perhaps to witness the miracles Jesus was known to perform. This story is clearly related to the Last Supper format as recounted in the other Gospels – and again affirms the miracle of Jesus and divine providence.

No matter why the people came – that they were there is important to Jesus and the disciples – that they are hungry and are fed. Their witnessing the miracle prompts the people to want to make Jesus their king. What is our parallel today? We witness the miracle of Jesus presence among us every time we come to worship through the Liturgy: Jesus is present, the Church tells us, in the gathered people, in the Word, in the priest and in the Eucharist. If we truly believe this awesome truth, our hearts and lives are bound to be converted – to be changed as we are nourished by the Bread of Life.

We are called, not so much to follow Jesus across the Sea of Galilee, but through the "sea" of our daily tasks and decisions. In the words of the Morning Offering – our "prayers, works, joys and sufferings" -- that's where we encounter opportunities to witness to Jesus whom we receive as the Bread of Life, the **Bread for life**. Jesus, through his disciples, distributed the loaves and fishes, and we are called to share the abundance of graces received in the Eucharist through our love and service to one another. We each have other gifts, our time, our attention, our compassion and care, that we are called to share with others.

May we remember how blessed we are to be nourished by the Bread for Life and be challenged by that Eucharist to be life-nourishing for others. God bless!

### FORMATION IN FAITH



In 2020 the US Conference of Catholic Bishops published the "**Directory for Catechesis**". We tend to think of catechesis – catechism and faith formation – as something for children and youth. But as we hear in the Gospels, Jesus is teaching adults, which is the model for catechesis. The emphasis on the importance of Adult Faith Formation has long been part of the Vision of the Church; from the time of Pope Leo XIII the Church has encouraged adult faith development especially for parents of children in catechetical formation programs.

Certainly from the 1950's and 60's, nurtured by the growth in theological and Scripture studies, and Vatican Council II, the catechetical and liturgical renewal have worked to re-energize adult faith formation, which, for decades, took a "backseat" to Catholic schools usually staffed by religious communities of Sisters, Brothers and priests. Gradually, and gratefully, Church leaders are recognizing the real need for adult faith formation, especially through a deeper catechesis focused on the Scriptures, the Mass, sacraments and the wider liturgical treasures of the Church. Studies show a need for a better understanding of the elements of our Creed and prayers we often take for granted.

Gathering together to learn, pray and share has been a true gift for so many. Building community and growing in faith are life-long blessings. Parent meetings with catechesis, short study courses, periodicals and books, study groups and fellowship gatherings are enriching options. Also available resources and technology offer many options for personalized learning through DVD programs, on-line webinars and courses. The KEY is to recognize our own need to grow and learn – and then start – or renew – the journey!

## UN DATO CLAVE DE LAS APARICIONES APROBADAS POR LA IGLESIA CATÓLICA

El Cardenal Ratzinger explicó que en la doctrina de la Iglesia existen dos tipos de revelaciones: la pública y la privada. La revelación pública es "la acción reveladora de Dios destinada a toda la humanidad, que ha encontrado su expresión literaria en las dos partes de la Biblia: el Antiguo y el Nuevo Testamento". Al respecto, indicó que en Cristo "Dios ha dicho todo" y que la "revelación ha concluido con la realización del misterio de Cristo", contenido en el Nuevo Testamento. No obstante, recordó que el Catecismo indica que si bien la revelación está finalizada, no está del todo explicitada. En este contexto, describió que la revelación privada "se refiere a todas las visiones y revelaciones que tienen lugar una vez terminado el Nuevo Testamento; es ésta la categoría dentro de la cual debemos colocar el mensaje de Fátima", precisó.

## Santa María de los Ángeles

El día 2 de agosto es la fiesta de Santa María de los Ángeles, patrona de Costa Rica y de los franciscanos. En 1635 la mestiza Juana Pereira descubrió una pequeña

imagen de María con el Niño Dios. Varias veces la imagen se le perdió y regresaba al sitio donde la había encontrado el día 2 de agosto. Por esta razón el lugar a donde regresaba se convirtió en su santuario y se le dio el título de Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles en honor de la capilla dedicada a Santa María de los Ángeles afuera del pueblito de Asís en Italia. Esta capillita reconocida como la Porciúncula (pedacito de tierra) fue restaurada por san Francisco. Allí nació la familia franciscana y Francisco insistió que los frailes nunca abandonaran ese lugar porque era consagrado a Dios. Allí María y los ángeles alababan a Dios cuando los seres humanos habían dejado de hacerlo. Según parece, la imagen costarricense también insistió en quedarse en un pedacito de tierra consagrado a Dios donde sus hijos e hijas pueden recurrir a ella y adorar al Dios eterno.

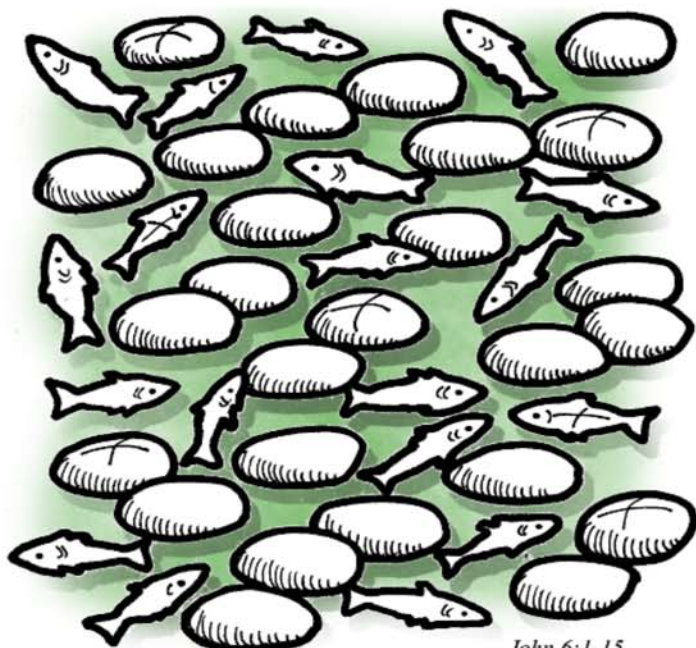
Jesus still multiplies what we give Him today. At Mass we offer to God some bread and wine and He turns it into the Body and Blood of Jesus!

## Shrine of St. James in Compostela

Last Thursday, the greatest pilgrimage in our tradition ended with the feast of Saint James at his shrine in Compostela, Spain. Every year, as many as a hundred thousand persons walk a portion of the medieval way of the pilgrim, earning the right to

wear the scallop shell symbol of this journey of faith. In legend, this city on the northern coast of Spain is the final resting place of the apostle, and the full name of the cathedral is "Saint James of the Field of Stars." There is a tradition that Saint James the Great preached there. In the Roman Catholic tradition, the pilgrimage, like any procession, is a symbol, life's journey distilled, a powerful sign of our journey toward a certain goal. The perils of the road, the support of companions, the contemplative slower pace of life, have the potential to transform and renew the pilgrims in ways that last a lifetime. Along the way, the distinctions between rich and poor fall away, and everyone shares humble rustic food and stops for the night in hostels or under the stars. After a long walk, the experience of entering through the great doors into the vast cathedral filled with incense, light, and song is a foretaste of heaven. The pilgrims often say that their whole lives are redirected toward that moment of entry into the heavenly Jerusalem. The most memorable feature of the cathedral is called the botofumeiro, an incense burner on pulleys and chains that sweeps through the cathedral in immense circles, swirling clouds of sweet-smelling incense around the vast nave.
