

### REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY


19<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
EUCHARIST: BREAD OF LIFE

Today the Church continues to nourish us with the Word of God at every liturgy. This Sunday's Gospel is part of the Bread of Life discourse of John's Gospel, which is always woven into the Cycle B summer Sundays. Because there are several weeks with this Gospel theme of Jesus as the Bread of Life, the Church pairs the first reading referencing some Old Testament stories of the need for and nourishment of bread. Today we hear of Elijah and the bread, "a hearth cake" and water which gave him nourishment for his 40 days of travel to Mount Horeb.

With a bit of research, I found that Mount Horeb is another name for Mount Sinai, the mountain on which God gave Moses the commandments of the Hebrew Testament, and on which the Covenant between God and God's chosen people was forged. That Elijah walked 40 days and 40 nights echoes the symbolic "40", the number of years the Israelites were in the desert on their way to the promised land. The purposeful links lead us to reflection. Appropriately, the Responsorial Psalm invites us taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

Take a few moments to reflect on the goodness of the Lord, the blessings received, the prayers answered (sometimes in ways other than what we had planned!), the faith, family and friends that enrich and help guide our lives. Still immersed in the National Eucharistic Revival, we readily recognize the awesome and nourishing "Bread of Life" given to us in and through the Eucharist, Jesus Himself. The Bread of Life nourishes us to continue to walk in the way of the Lord; we are fed in order that we may share with others the Word of God, the Good News of Jesus Christ. We are sent to glorify the Lord by our lives, to share the peace of Christ with others. This is the time to evaluate how we have been changed by the Eucharist we receive, whether we have indeed been "taught by God" as Jesus quotes the prophets in the Gospel. We receive the Bread of Life that we might become Bread for the world, so much in need to truth and goodness. Taking time to reflect on the Bread of Life in our own lives can lead us to a sort of summer retreat, a much-needed time to deepen our gratitude for the Eucharist. The Body of Christ. Amen. The Blood of Christ, Amen.

### FORMED BY FAITH



What does it look like in daily life to be formed by faith? All around us we see people who are living out their Christian beliefs, who care for those in need, whether the need is for food, companionship, forgiveness, compassion or simply the presence of an attentive listener. We are formed by faith so that we can live a life of faith. "Accompaniment" is one of the terms that Pope Francis uses to encourage each of us to be a missionary disciple, so that having taken time and care to deepen our own faith and understanding of the Gospel, we willing accompany another on the faith journey in daily life.

Perhaps the most familiar model of that is the story of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus the day of the resurrection (Luke 24). Not understanding what has been happening back in Jerusalem, they head home to Emmaus when a stranger joins them, listens to their story, their confusion, and takes time to accompany them, explaining to them the Scriptures and events. At dinner, after the stranger has broken bread and they recognized the Risen Jesus, they exclaim, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" With that insight, they hurried back to Jerusalem to meet up with the rest of their community to share the good news!

As we encounter persons in daily life, there is most likely one with whom we could attentively walk in faith. While always aware of the larger community - and the world in need of care and prayer - we are conscious of accompanying one or two persons in a special way. May our hearts too burn with faith and joy as we walk together along the way.



# STRENGTHENED BY THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today we resume the "Bread of Life" discourse from John's Gospel that began two weeks ago. He makes reference to the Jews' ancestors who ate manna in the desert. These days we would think primarily of Israel wandering in the desert, but faithful Jews would also have known the story of Elijah that we hear today. Strengthened by food and drink in the desert, the angel of the Lord sends him on his forty-day and forty-night journey (the biblical number for a preparation time). Like the food given to Elijah in the desert, Jesus tells his listeners that he is bread for the life of the world. It is very important that we not stop listening to Jesus after his promise of eternal life-a marvelous promise, but this "reward" is not the only reason we feast on the Bread of Life.



# Monasteries in the U.S.

The oldest monastic communities in the United States refer to the colonial states. The Louisiana Purchase gained a great treasure for our nation, the Ursuline monastery of New Orleans. Among the greatest pioneers of that city were nuns who came from France on a perilous voyage in 1727, pestered by pirates and tossed by fearsome storms. These were genteel, well-educated Ursulines, yet their first task was to roll up their sleeves and open a hospital to care for the pestilence-ridden colony. Next, they opened a school for girls and launched a plan to educate the women being shipped over from France to marry settlers. In this way, they had enormous influence in molding patterns of family and domestic life. At Christmastime in 1814, the threat of a British assault on the city was growing. On the terrifying night of January 7, 1815, the women of New Orleans gathered in the monastery chapel to pray that the city be spared from destruction in battle. The mother superior made a vow to have a Mass of Thanksgiving on that date every year should the Americans win. That night, Our Lady of Prompt Succor, to whom the nuns had great devotion, became the protector and patron of this great city. The convent in the French Quarter is the oldest standing building in the Mississippi valley, and the only surviving building of the French colonial period. The nuns relocated in 1824, but their old monastery is preserved as a museum and archives for the Archdiocese of New Orleans. The school the nuns began, Ursuline Academy, is the oldest continuously operating Catholic school, and school for women, in the United States.
