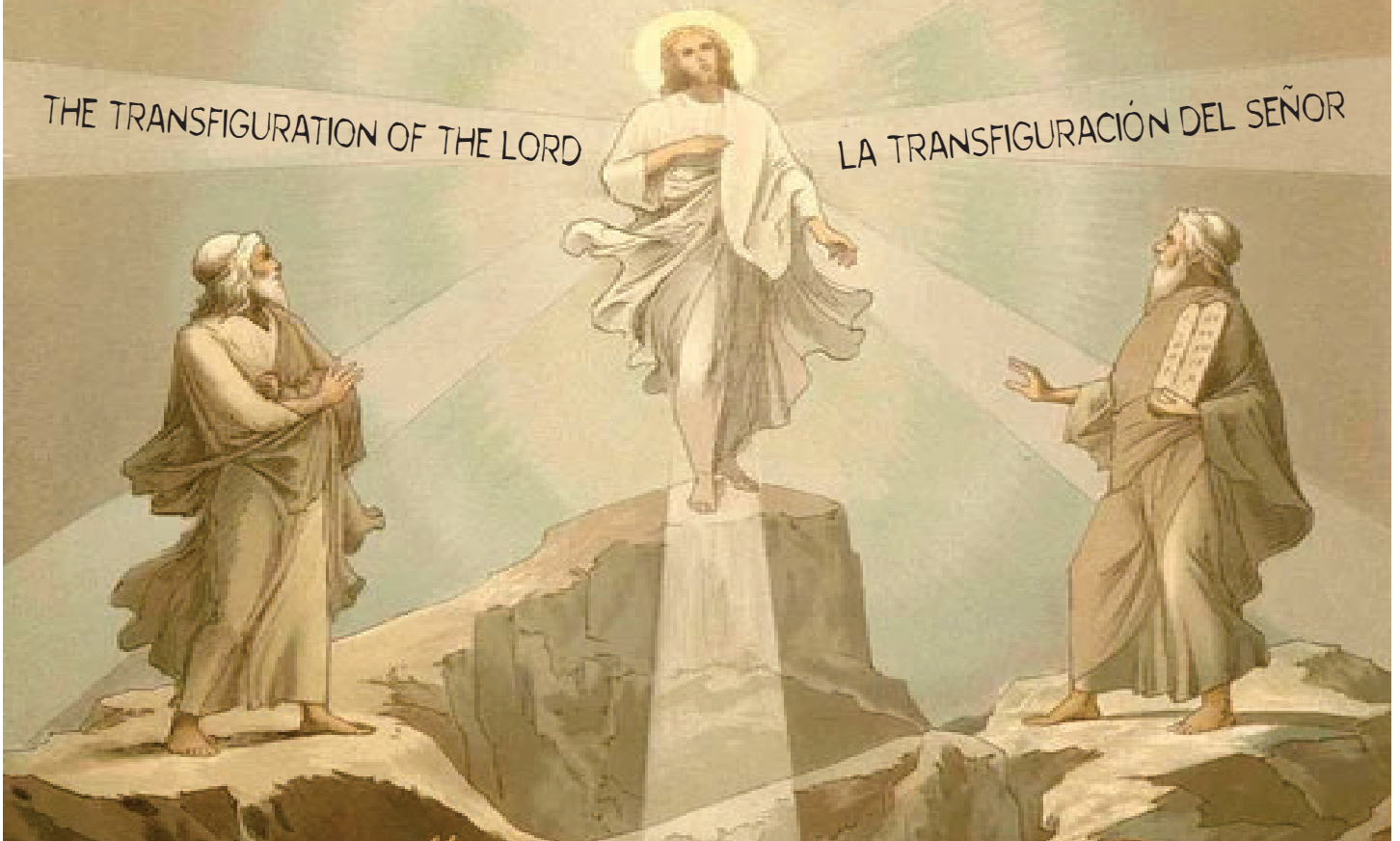

Transfiguration of Our Lord

This Sunday's readings introduce the themes of the Lenten season: the Covenant between God and God's people, and the process of transformation.

Abram's encounter with God brings about the Covenant, and transforms his life, fulfilling his lifetime dream of many descendants – and changing his name to Abraham in the process. Paul's letter to the Philippians speaks clearly about the transformation to which disciples are called: we are made for a heavenly kingdom, not simply for earthly existence. The faithfulness of the disciples will gain for them their unity with the Lord Jesus Christ.

It is especially in the Gospel story that we hear of the power of faithfulness, through the transfiguration of Jesus, standing with two great figures of the Hebrew Covenant – Moses and Elijah – who also appear in glory. The three chosen disciples who witness the transfiguration then hear the divine message affirming Jesus as the chosen one.

Each year, on the second Sunday of Lent we hear a Gospel story of the transfiguration. The placement of this Gospel on the Sunday after the story of Jesus withstanding the temptations teaches us each year at the beginning of Lent that we are called to take to heart and be faithful to the Covenant with God. That New Covenant is what God offers with us through his Son – the gift of redemption. Our Lenten journey of conversion – change, transformation – into ever more faithful disciples is strengthened with the care, mercy, forgiveness and love of God who is ever with us. As we do the works of mercy (Matthew 25: 31-46) we may find ourselves beginning to recognize in our brothers and sisters whom we serve the face of Jesus who comes to us in many guises in daily life. God is among us, with us and within us when we are living our faith. What an awesome God who is faithful to his covenant of love and who cares for us that much!

Lent is a time of retreat and renewal of our spiritual selves in the spirit of conversion. We turn to the Lord and reshape our lives into the fullness of the spirit of disciples and apostles. As we continue to learn about and live the works of mercy, our hearts and lives may be transformed into the likeness of Jesus Christ.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE



Among our Lenten experiences, there are a few "standards": fasting, abstinence, good works and Stations of the Cross. As Catholics we are familiar with the spirit of fasting – the

one hour before receiving Holy Communion is the most common rule, **fasting** from food and drink. Other forms of fasting like **our Lenten fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday guide us to one main meal, two smaller meals and no eating between meals. Though the regulations of this Lenten fast apply to those between the ages of 18 and 59, many others will also take care to observe the fast to the best of their ability and health. Keeping the spirit of Lent is not only denying ourselves but, as Pope Francis and other leaders before him have told us, this is about spiritually acknowledging our sins and weaknesses, about conversion of our hearts and choices, to be living more faithfully in accord with the Gospel.

The **discipline of abstinence** is refraining from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. Again, while this discipline is required of all Catholics aged 14 and older, there are many who also continue that sense of "keeping Friday" throughout the year. It may not mean complete abstinence from meat; it may take the shape of simpler meals or of donating funds for the feeding of the poor.

Along with our attentiveness to a more developed time for **prayer** during Lent, the Stations of the Cross, more frequent participation in Mass, and celebration of the sacrament of Penance, the focus on **doing good works** is another "pillar of Lent", helping to reawaken our habits of the works of mercy. Acts of care and charity that help others both physically and spiritually, some are spoken by Jesus as the terms of judgment in Matthew 25:35-42. The others have been part of our catechesis for Catholic Christian living.

We know we are looking forward to Holy Week and the Triduum, to commemorate the great events of our redemption. We enter this season with the "end in mind" – that we too have died to ourselves in order to rise to renewed life in joy and peace with Jesus.

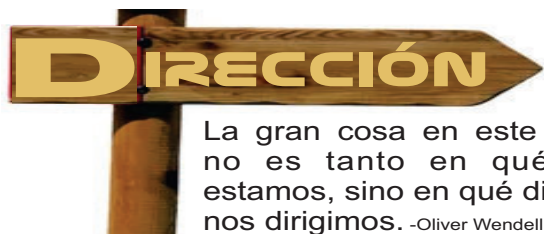
CONVERSIÓN EN LA CUARESMA

Alianza y Transfiguración

Las lecturas de este domingo introducen los temas de la temporada de Cuaresma: el Pacto entre Dios y su pueblo, y el proceso de transformación.

El encuentro de Abram con Dios da lugar al Pacto y transforma su vida, cumpliendo su sueño de toda la vida de tener muchos descendientes, y cambiando su nombre a Abraham en el proceso. La carta de Pablo a los filipenses habla claramente de la transformación a la que están llamados los discípulos: estamos hechos para un reino celestial, no simplemente para la existencia terrenal. La fidelidad de los discípulos les ganará su unidad con el Señor Jesucristo.

Es especialmente en la historia del Evangelio donde escuchamos sobre el poder de la fidelidad, a través de la transfiguración de Jesús, de pie con dos grandes figuras del Pacto hebreo: Moisés y Elías, que también aparecen en gloria. Los tres discípulos elegidos que presencian la transfiguración escuchan entonces el mensaje divino que afirma a Jesús como el elegido.

Cada año, en el segundo domingo de Cuaresma escuchamos una historia del Evangelio sobre la transfiguración. La colocación de este Evangelio en el domingo después de la historia de Jesús resistiendo las tentaciones nos enseña cada año al comienzo de la Cuaresma que estamos llamados a tomar en serio y ser fieles al Pacto con Dios. Ese Nuevo Pacto es lo que Dios ofrece con nosotros a través de su Hijo, el don de la redención. Nuestra jornada de conversión Cuaresmal, cambio, transformación, en discípulos cada vez más fieles, se fortalece con el cuidado, la misericordia, el perdón y el amor de Dios que siempre está con nosotros. Mientras hacemos las obras de misericordia (Mateo 25:31-46), podemos comenzar a reconocer en nuestros hermanos y hermanas a quienes servimos el rostro de Jesús que viene a nosotros en muchas formas en la vida diaria. Dios está entre nosotros, con nosotros y dentro de nosotros cuando vivimos nuestra fe. ¡Qué Dios tan asombroso que es fiel a su pacto de amor y que nos cuida tanto!

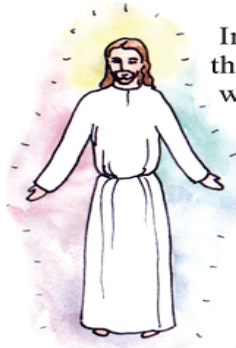

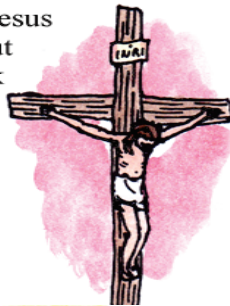
Looking at Jesus

SAINT CYRIL OF JERUSALEM - MARCH 18

SAINT CYRIL WAS BORN IN JERUSALEM AROUND THE YEAR 315. HE WAS RAISED A CHRISTIAN AND WELL EDUCATED. HE BECAME A DEACON AND THEN A PRIEST.

HE WAS ORDAINED BISHOP OF JERUSALEM, BUT A HERETIC BISHOP NEARBY REFUSED TO ACCEPT HIM. "I am in charge of Jerusalem too!"

CYRIL ARGUED AGAINST THE ARIAN HERESY BUT HE DID NOT UNDERSTAND THE TRINITY HIMSELF EITHER. "I know that Jesus was alive even before He became Man."

"Yes, Jesus and the Father are consubstantial." EVENTUALLY HE DID AGREE WITH THE CHURCH TEACHING AT A COUNCIL.

SAINT CYRIL TAUGHT THE FAITH TO THE NEW CHRISTIANS. WE STILL HAVE SOME OF HIS TEACHINGS. "Do not think it mere bread and wine."

MEANWHILE, HE WAS SENT INTO EXILE THREE TIMES BY THE HERETICS AND THE EMPEROR. "He sold church furniture to help the poor!" "Send him away!"

FINALLY HE CAME BACK AND FOUND JERUSALEM IN A SAD STATE OF SIN AND CORRUPTION. HE WORKED THERE UNTIL HE DIED AROUND THE AGE OF 70.

AT FIRST CYRIL DIDN'T HAVE A VERY GOOD UNDERSTANDING OF THE HOLY TRINITY, BUT HE KNEW THAT THE ARIANS WERE WRONG. THEY SAID JESUS WAS LESS IMPORTANT THAN GOD THE FATHER. CYRIL TAUGHT WHAT HE KNEW WAS RIGHT ANYWAY. DO YOU TELL OTHERS WHAT YOU KNOW ABOUT GOD?



OUR ELECT



The Rite of Election, celebrated in the Holy Catholic Church, marks the divine election of Christ Jesus over the Catechumens. The Catechumens are individuals who have been in deep preparation through their Christian initiation formation, longing for baptism in the Church and the reception of the sacred sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation, on the night of the celebration of the Easter Vigil. The Rite of Election includes the inscription of the names of all Catechumens chosen by God.

This past Saturday, March 8th, the Rite of Election took place in our diocese in a ceremony presided over by our Bishop Alberto Rojas. Our Catechumens, with hearts burning with faith, reaffirmed their fervent desire to continue their spiritual formation more deeply, thus entering their new stage of Illumination and Purification to receive the sacred sacraments of Initiation. In his inspiring homily, Bishop Alberto reiterated to the Catechumens that it is Jesus who has chosen them and that they are responding with love and devotion to His divine call.

As our now elect continue their journey of faith, reflecting and renouncing sin in preparation for the reception of their sacraments of initiation, let us pray to Almighty God for them. Let us remember that we too seek illumination and purification in this holy time of Lent, as we draw closer to the glorious paschal mystery. - Bruce Vouziers L.E.M
