REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY

21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY
TIME: THE POWER OF CHOICE

This week's readings present to us a chal-

lenging contrast. Joshua gathers all the tribes of Israel and confronts them with this key choice: Whom will you serve? They have been surrounded by peoples with other gods – in Egypt ("beyond the River") and in the land where they now dwell. The simplicity and strength of Joshua's own proclamation inspires all the people: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." The gathered people also chose to serve the Lord, acknowledging that he is their God, remembering that God performed great miracles and protected them along their journey.

In his Letter to the Ephesians, Paul speaks to the relationship between husband and wife, modeled on the love that Christ has for his Church – so much so that Christ gave his life for his people. This selection – perhaps like the words of Jesus in the Gospel – can be misunderstood unless we really look deeply into the meaning behind it and the mystery of self-sacrifice and total self-giving. When we truly love one another, the great degree of mutuality is the pattern of relationship to one another, out of love, service, care and compassion. This letter teaches that marriage is a foreshadowing of the union between Christ and the Church. The love, reverence and respect in which we hold one another is part of that grace of self-giving, the choice we make to honor and love one another.

The Gospel reading recounts that many of the followers of Jesus are troubled by his statements of being the Living Bread: they choose to no longer follow him because they do not understand or believe – and seem to have forgotten the miracles he has performed. Many of the followers of Jesus could not fathom the depth of the self-giving love of Jesus. It was only the chosen disciples, through their spokesperson Simon Peter, who state their belief in Jesus as the Holy One of God. Even for them, the Mystery of the teachings of Jesus was still unfolding.

In these weeks we have heard Jesus proclaim "I am the Bread of Life." The point for us is our belief in the Real Presence and that every time we receive the Eucharist, we are transformed – or should be – a little more into the Body of Christ. St. Augustine exhorts us: Behold what you are. Become what you receive.

So we come full circle to the statement of Joshua: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." That is our choice – to believe, to serve, to love and to give of ourselves in the spirit of Jesus, the Living Bread.

THE AMBRY AND HOLY OILS



There is a special place for the three holy oils that are brought to our parish from the

Chrism Mass during Holy Week each year.

Here at our church, that special place or small cabinet called the **ambry** is in the west corner of the sanctuary, near the tabernacle. All these holy oils are made from olive oil. One of the three, the **Oil of the Sick (Oleum Infirmorum "OI")**, has been blessed by our Bishop at the Chrism Mass with prayers that invoke the presence, power and grace of the Holy Spirit to strengthen those who are seriously ill or in danger of death. The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is written within the Church's document titled "Pastoral Care of the Sick".

Another is the **Oil of Catechumens (Oleum Sanctum "OS")** blessed by our Bishop at the Chrism Mass, for anointing the unbaptized during their formation; for adult catechumens, there is a special rite intended to strengthen them during the period of the catechumenate, prior to the Rite of Election, to strengthen them through prayer and the anointing by a priest or deacon. In the rite of baptism of infants, the Oil of Catechumens is used prior to baptism, after the liturgy of the Word, the intercessions and the litany of saints.

The third is **Sacred Chrism ((Sanctum Chrisma "SC")** blended with balsam, giving it a distinct scent, has been consecrated by our Bishop. This is a bit different from the other two, used in several sacraments, in the rites of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. Sacred Chrism is also used in the consecration of churches, altars and the sacred vessels used at Mass.

Once blessed by the bishop, the chrism and other oils are no longer ordinary ointments, but rather they are holy and precious gifts from God to the Church so that through the power of the Holy Spirit, they may help bring about the cleansing, healing, comfort and strengthening of those who have been anointed

BEATA Narcisa de Jesús Martillo Morán

Narcisa de Jesús Martillo Morán nació el día de san Narciso (29 de octubre, 1832), hija de

campesinos ecuatorianos. Vivió su vida como costurera y doméstica. Falleció en Perú en 1869. Su fe se distinguió por su amor a la presencia de Jesús Sacramentado en la Eucaristía, sus prácticas de penitencia y sus obras de caridad. Cuando aún era joven, conoció la vida de la recientemente beatificada y ahora santa, Marianita de Jesús, "la Azucena de Quito" (1618 1645). La vida de esta santa mujer latina la inspiró a vivir como mejor cristiana, buscando ser guiada espiritualmente por una serie de directores espirituales. En esta laica beata, encontramos dos puntos de reflexión para nosotros los latinos. El primero es la necesidad de conocer nuestros santos latinos no sólo para recurrir a ellos sino para imitar su santidad. Lo segundo es la necesidad de buenos directores espirituales, ya sean sacerdotes, religiosos, religiosas, laicos o laicas. La dirección espiritual es una práctica antigua en nuestra Iglesia y muchos hombres y mujeres han sido directores espirituales para guiar a personas como Narcisa, ayudándoles en el camino a la santidad.

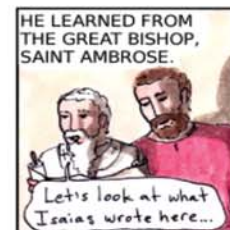
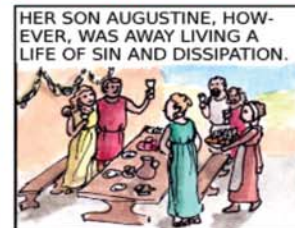
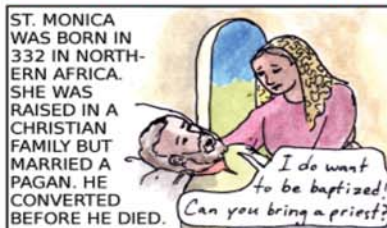

HOUSEHOLDS IN GOD'S SERVICE

In the ancient world, "household" was a wide-reaching concept. When Joshua today speaks of his household serving the Lord,

he meant not just those people who lived inside his walls or those related to him by blood or marriage; he meant slaves or servants and their families, and anyone indebted to him in any way. Even his livestock and other possessions would be consecrated to service of God. In our world, we value allowing individuals their freedom to choose how they live, and wouldn't think of offering our pets to the service of God. But, as we discern our vocation as disciples baptized into Christ, we can come to realize how far-ranging the "households" of our lives still are: how we act toward our spouses, children, roommates or anyone we live with; our behavior with neighbors; or in public as we encounter many "strangers" every day in stores or traffic who suddenly are "next door" to us. How can we use our time, our resources, or gifts for selfless reasons rather than personal gain? No matter what life our witness to the Good News calls us to, we all have a "household" that must be consecrated to service of the Lord our God.

Vacation

This is the height of vacation season, but as anyone who has ever been to Rome in the summer knows, no time to visit there! The city is sweltering, and in a pre-air-conditioned world long ago, Romans figured out that they needed a break in the surrounding hills. Even the pope clears out. His destination is usually Castelgandolfo, a lovely little hill town southeast of Rome,

overlooking a tranquil lake. It has been a papal possession since about 1600, and in 1929, when most of the papal states were finally lost, the papal dwelling was given "extraterritorial rights," meaning that it is an extension of Vatican City and not under Italian rule. The Vatican observatory maintained telescopes here for decades, far from the glare of the city lights of Rome, but although the observatory offices remain here year round, the telescopes are in Arizona. Pope Francis spends less time here than his predecessors, though he still slows down the pace of his work in Rome.

The Call to Community



Humans gather in groups. In our Catholic faith, we are One Body with Christ. As One Body, we are called to care for all. That is, establish the common good. "The common good embraces the sum of those conditions of social life by which individuals, families, and groups can achieve their own fulfillment in a relatively thorough and ready way," said the Second Vatican Council document, the Gaudium et Spes, (The Church in the Modern World).

We may be called to sacrifice occasionally for justice – something that the modern world often has a hard time appreciating. Our definition of community is not limited to those in our immediate neighborhood, but expands (with various degrees of influence and responsibility) to the entire world. We can have the most impact for good on our families, but we can also improve our neighborhood, city, state, nation and world through a variety of means such community service or advocacy. "Christians must be conscious of their specific and proper role in the political community; they should be a shining example by their sense of responsibility and their dedication to the common good; they should show in practice how authority can be reconciled with freedom, personal initiative with solidarity and the needs of the social framework as a whole, and the advantages of unity with the benefits of diversity." Gaudium et Spes (The Church in the Modern World).
